

2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

• Academic Calendar

The academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for the academic year are planned well before the commencement of the academic year. This academic calendar is made available to all students on the start of the academic year.

- Academic Diary
 - Academic diary is provided to each faculty which contains planning of the workload, time table, term wise days available for teaching, record of leaves taken, lectures and synopsis of every lecture/practical and account of lectures planned and taken. It includes certification of completion of syllabus at the end of semester.
 - Academic work is allocated as per the norms and discussion in departmental meetings.
 - Academic diary also includes Academic Performance Indicator (API) sheets to be filled by the faculty at the end of the academic year.
 - Academic diary is checked by the Head/ In charge of the department and endorsed by the Principal periodically.

Allocation of Work

Academic, co-curricular and other related work is allocated among the staff by constituting different committees and associations.

• Learner Centric Teaching

The college has developed learner centric teaching system, where the academic as well as other activities are focused for overall development of learners.

• Strengthening of Academic Programmes

Career oriented graduate, postgraduate, research programmes, diploma, certificate and bridge courses in faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce are strengthened in respect of teaching-learning and evaluation aspects.

• Extensive Use of ICT in Teaching

The faculty uses various ICT based teaching techniques and aids such as audiovisuals, smart boards, interactive language laboratory, etc. Special efforts are made to improve the learning and communication skill of learners. AQAR 2017-2018



Motivation for Research

- The faculty and learners are motivated to undertake research activities such as preparation of projects, publication of research papers in reputed journals and participation and presentation of research papers in seminars / workshops / conferences.
- Faculty are motivated to undertake research students at postgraduate and Ph.D. degree programmes.
- Teachers are encouraged for consultancy and undertaking minor/major research projects from different funding agencies.
- Learners and teachers are also encouraged to go for research degrees like, M.Phil., Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral Programmes. Computers with internet facility are made available for research students and staff members for the completion of their projects and research work.
- Learners at UG, PG and research levels are motivated and guided by faculty to participate in Avishkar Research Convention which helps to create their interest in research.

Resource Centers and Interactive Language Laboratory

The college has established Commerce and Management Resource Center, Science Resource Center, Computing Laboratory, Smart Class Room and upgraded Interactive Language Laboratory. The teachers and students make the use of these centers for experiential learning, research work and updating with recent developments in their respective courses of study.

• Participative and Continuous Evaluation of Learners

Introduction of Choice Base Credit System (CBCS), evaluates the learners on the basis of continuous internal assessment and assessment of learners by Semester End Examinations. It is learner friendly and awards the grades on the basis of learners overall performance/engagement in academics

• Categorization of the learners according to their academic performance

College has developed software for scrutiny of learners' database according to well set variables including academic performance, participation and achievements in curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular and extension activities. Based on this, learners are categorized into slow learners, medium learners and advanced learners. Every department receives the categorization of the learners from administrative office and the department plans and conducts appropriate methods for progression of learners.

• Mentoring of learners through Parent-Teacher Scheme

In this scheme, faculty as an academic parent mentors the learner in enhancing the participation and performance in academics. A specific group of learners of particular programme is allotted to concerned faculty. Parent teacher monitors and ensures active participation of learner in teaching learning process.

• Evaluation of faculty by Learner

IQAC has designed a specific feedback form to be filled by learner for evaluation of faculty. The various components of teaching and learning process have been incorporated in feedback form. The feedback given by learner is analyzed and discussed with faculty for improvement and up gradation in teaching learning process.

2.8 Examination /Evaluation Reforms initiated by the Institution (for example: Open Book Examination, Bar Coding, Double Valuation, Photocopy, Online Multiple Choice Questions)

• As our college is affiliated with University of Mumbai we are conducting our examination according to the rules & regulations of University of Mumbai which comprises of Internal & semester - end examinations in each semester. Both these examinations are centralized at our college in order to maintain the code of conduct and follow a process of systematic and continuous evaluation.



Some of the examination reforms initiated by the Institution are

- Testing learners understanding in an objective manner.
- Online Testing of learners in certain specialized undergraduate programmes such as Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS), B.Com (Accounting& Finance) and B.Sc. Information Technology.
- Flexibility to faculty in conducting assignments with a weightage of 10 marks for the internal assessment examinations.

Some of the reforms in the evaluation system are:

- Following the system of Masking to maintain secrecy in the process of evaluation.

2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

• Monitoring of Teaching and Learning process

IQAC contributes in evolving the mechanisms and procedures for ensuring the quality enhancement and quality sustenance in teaching and learning process. It develops the quality parameters of high standard for effective and efficient teaching and learning process.

IQAC prepares teaching and learning schedule and monitors the execution of the schedule for quality enhancement and quality sustenance in teaching and learning process.

1. Academic Calendar

IQAC contributes in planning and preparation of academic calendar of the activities to be undertaken during the academic year and is communicated to the faculty at the commencement of academic year through the meeting. This calendar includes series of academic activities to be conducted, examination schedule, organization of seminars and workshops and other co-curricular, extra-curricular and extension activities.

2. Academic Dairy

IQAC has designed an academic dairy for all faculty in which planning of the syllabus, allocation of workload, time table of the faculty, number of teaching days available is included. The faculty unities the syllabus month wise as per the teaching days available and to be endorsed by head of the department and authenticated by the Principal. The academic dairy records the execution of teaching by the faculty and also includes the brief account of syllabus completion

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and other related aspects along with academic performance indicator sheet of the faculty at the end of academic year.

3. Organization of Workshops and Seminars

IQAC prepares the schedule for organization of workshops, seminars, conferences and training programmes for the academic year. At the commencement of academic year, IQAC identify the departments to undertake these programmes and ask them to prepare the proposals for approval from various funding agencies. The proposals are scrutinized by IQAC and endorsed by the Principal and then submitted to the concerned authorities for its sanction.

4. Motivation and Promotion of Research of Faculty and Learners

IQAC has significant contribution in promotion and motivation of research in the institution. The faculty is informed to prepare the research proposals and forward to various funding agencies for financial assistance. Faculty is motivated to publish the research work in reputed national and international journals. The faculty is deputed for presentation of research work in seminars and conferences at various levels. IQAC ensures the continuous dissemination of information to the faculty on research activities. Institution supports and promotes the faculty for perusing the higher degrees in research.

IQAC has the mechanism for monitoring the research activities among the learners through participation in avishkar research conventions, society based projects through N.S.S., deputation of learners for attending National/International seminars, workshops and conferences. IQAC directs the departments for participation of learners in research competitions organized by college and at other institutions.

5. Use of modern methods of Teaching and Learning

IQAC monitors the use of modern methods for efficient/effective teaching and learning process. IQAC encourage the faculty to use ICT based teaching techniques such as audio-visuals, smart boards, interactive language laboratory etc. for effective teaching and learning. IQAC encourages the learners to use central library, departmental library, computing laboratory, Commerce and Management Resource Centre, Science Resource Centre, digital library, e-learning, e-books and periodicals for better learning.

6. Monitoring the Academic Progress of the Learners

IQAC has developed the Parent-Teacher Scheme to monitor the academic progress of the learners throughout the academic year. The learners at final year of the Programme (beginning of Semester V) are allocated to the faculty who are





teaching to them. The faculty monitors the academic progress of the learner by taking feedback of attendance, performance in the test-tutorials, continuous observation by developing the rapport with them to solve their academic difficulties.

• Evaluation of Teaching and Learning Process

IQAC evaluates the teaching and learning process through various parameters and communicate the outcome to concern stakeholders.

- 1. IQAC has designed the mechanism to evaluate the teaching and learning process by checking the academic dairy of the faculty by Head of the Department regularly and by the Principal periodically. The syllabus completion report is evaluated by the Principal to ensure the completion of the syllabus by the faculty.
- 2. The casual leaves and duty leaves are sanctioned only after the adjustment of work for smooth teaching and learning process.
- 3. IQAC takes the periodical feedback of the activities allocated to each department for effective teaching and learning process and its result is evaluated on the basis of factual information.
- 4. IQAC organizes the meeting of faculty/head of the departments/chairman of the different committees and associations to have deliberative interaction for smooth maintain of the holistic state of affair within the campus.
- 5. IQAC has evolved the system of feedback from all the stakeholders for progressive teaching, learning and evaluation process. IQAC has designed a feedback questionnaire on Teachers' Quality consisting of various evaluative parameters. The learners' responses are analyzed with the use of software. The outcome of the analysis is communicated to the faculty by serving either a letter of appreciation or a letter of caution for their information and further improvement in Teaching and Learning.
- 6. IQAC contributes in evaluation of the curriculum by inviting the feedback from Academic Peers from other University. This feedback is communicated to the concerned Board of Studies of University for consideration.
- 7. IQAC monitors the Examination system of the college and suggests the reforms for timely evaluation of the learners.

5. Student Support and Progression

4. The Practice

Measures

The measures are carried out holistically with systematic and objective manner. The plan of action is as follows:

• Meeting

The Principal convene the meeting of all faculty members of Department of English in the beginning of the academic year to discuss the line of action to be undertaken for effective execution of the practice.

• Communication

All members of Department of English communicate the aims and objectives of practice to all learners and members of faculty through notices, personal counselling and meetings.

• Collection of Information

The department collects the information of learners who are poor in communication from the faculty in charges and class teachers of all classes and disciplines and appeals them to take admission in certificate or diploma programme specially designed for improvement of communication skill of learners.

• Certificate and Diploma Programmes

The Department of English offers following certificate and diploma programmes for enrichment of communication skill of learners-


- Diploma Course in Conversational English

All these programmes build the capabilities of learners on significant aspects of communication skill like listening, grammar, vocabulary, accent, conversation, communication, pronunciation and presentation.

The department scheduled the working of these programmes at evening after completion of regular classes of learners.

• Use of Interactive Language Laboratory

The department conducts the certificate and diploma programmes in Interactive Language Laboratory where learners are trained rigorously with practical





aspects of communication skills. The Interactive Language Laboratory has 30 ICT supported learners stations with all modern amenities.

Language laboratory makes the learners to have interactive session. It provides equal opportunity to all learners to hear the instructor irrespective of place where they are seated. It also provides the privacy that encourages the shy learners to speak without any hesitation. In addition instructor can speak to individual or group of learners in privacy without interrupting rest of class. Language laboratory motivates learners to talk freely with their friends. Attention on subject is increased resulting in better retention of the concepts. Furthermore, it develops the listening and communication skills, since they hear correct pronunciation through their headphones. Learner will show more enthusiasm and excitement in learning lesson because of learning laboratory system. Instructor can look after each learner, which is not possible in case of the regular classroom. In a laboratory instructor can communicate with many learners by pressing a mouse key in order to talk with learners. Efficient use of time and learning efficiency is much more than usual classroom learning. This set up fosters more interactive session between learners and instructor. The language laboratory brings variety in teaching learning process instead of verbal centered teaching.

• Efforts for Carbon Neutrality


- Faculty, staff and learners are made cognizant about carbon emission from vehicles.

Hazardous Waste Management

- Faculty, staff and learners from Faculty of Science are made accustomed with hazardous waste management.
- Waste from the cafeteria and gardens are used to produce compost by specially appointed gardeners and the compost is used for all gardens of the campus and botanical garden.
- Hazardous chemicals are not used in the college laboratories. The minimal wastage is drained after reasonable treatment so as to make it non hazardous.



- Faculty, staff and learners from Faculty of Science are made acquainted with ewaste management.
- Non-working computers, monitors, printers, hardwares and all other e-waste are discarded and scrapped on a systematic basis. If some parts are useful, in other systems they are kept aside for future use.
- Learners from B.Sc. (Computer Science), M.Sc. (Computer Science), B.Sc. (Information Technology) and M.Sc. (Information Technology) are guided for ewaste management by the faculty.

Recycling of Waste Papers

Numbers of papers are required for administrative and academic work of college. Generally 17 trees and 1500 litres of oil required to produce one tonne of papers, which are used by us on daily working at college. In the academic year 2017-2018 has taken the mission of minimum use of papers and its recycling. The Process is monitored by steering committee. The steering committee appealed to all the constituents of the college for minimum use of paper and communicates the parameters to all faculty and learners like-

- Re-use the paper which has been used on one side.
- Make two-sided copies whenever necessary.
- Minimize the number of files.
- Use electronic media for communication whenever necessary.
- Promote electronic mailing.
- Collection of used papers.
- The steering committee collected the waste papers through the non-teaching staff and scrutinized it and sold it to authorized vendor who are directly attached to there-cycled companies or organizations.

Energy Conservation Programme

• Energy conservation is the reduction of quantity of energy used. Energy conservation supports the eco-friendly lifestyle by providing energy, which saves money and at the same time saves the earth. The energy conservation is cost effective with a short payback period and modest investment. The college has initiated the Energy Conservation Programme by replacing tungsten bulbs and incandescent tubes with LED bulbs and tubes. It also installed solar cell panels system which monitors the light of all passages of the college.

Production of Biogas from Food Waste of Cafeteria

• In the college about 4000 learners are taking the education in different disciplines. All these learners are coming to the college from Panvel city and nearby cities and villages. All of them are taking advantage of facilities of cafeteria provided by the college. During the working of cafeteria about 10 kg food waste was collected and disposed off every day. Hence it was decided to install a biogas plant and produce biogas from this food waste instead of disposing off.

Establishment of Effluent Treatment Plant

 In the science laboratories (Chemistry Laboratory, Microbiology Laboratory, Biotechnology Laboratory, Zoology Laboratory, etc.) major amount of chemicals and solvents are used. After laboratory works, effluents generated from chemicals and solvents are directly sent to the drainage system which leads to a pollution of water as well as soil. It may show adverse effects on other aspects of environment.

- The Effluent Treatment Plant which regulates adverse effects of effluents and helps in the environment conservation.

Vermicompost Unit

• The college has constructed the Vermicompost Unit consisting of three Vermicompost beds. All organic waste generated in the campus is used as a raw material for the process.
