The National Cadet Corps came into existence immediately after independence; the Kashmir war of 1948 was a bitter pill prompting the Govt. of India to reappoint the Kunjru Committee whose recommendations were instrumental in the inception of NCC on 16th of July 1948. The government of India accepted the recommendations of the committee and prepared a bill. This bill was passed by the parliament and made the national Cadet Corps Act, under this act NCC was opened in Schools and Colleges. To widen the scope of the NCC training, a Girl division in 1949, an Air wing in 1952, and Navy wing in 1952 were established. However, with voluntary enrolment recommenced in 1966, presently 1.35 million cadets are enrolled with the plans of raising the strength to 1.5 million, spread over 788 units fewer than 95 NCC groups led by ADG/DDG of the ranks of Major General/Brigadier equivalent in 17 Regional Directorates under the DNCC who is of the rank of Lieutenant General. National Cadet Corps acts as an interface for building a sense of patriotism, secular Ques, national unity, and social cohesion among the youth. 'NCC Studies' is an optional subject for F.C. where the syllabus apart from having social relevance in the Indian milieu has an emphasis on the overall development of the personality of cadets. Moreover, with the academic acknowledgement, the cadets will be better equipped to take up careers in civil services, defense, paramilitary, police and security forces further prompting increased demand by the students, augmenting recruitment standards of NCC. The students are thus provided with quality learning experiences through the meticulously planned curriculum with a perfect blend of theoretical knowledge & practical skills.

The 'NCC Studies' involves exposure to a range of subjects from Humanities to Science and Technology, apart from the Military Subjects taught both theoretically and practically. The theory and practical components of specialized subjects of Army, Navy, and Air Force, shall be imparted both in the classroom and on the field including the camps, ensuring 'Learnt be practiced'. The entire syllabus shall be covered by the concerned teachers and the Permanent Instructors (PI staff), deputed by the NCC. While the teacher is expected to give emphasis on the classroom teaching, the expertise of PI, shall be utilized for the instructional and practice sessions. The entire course shall be covered during the NCC parades which preferably be arranged during the working days, covering 30 periods per semester with a total of 60 periods per year. The program is divided into two semesters per academic year, with two credits per semester and four credits in an academic year. This programmer is categorized into three units per semester and a total of six units in an academic year. Institutional training, Camp training, Social Services and Community development, Adventure-based learning, Sports, Personality development, and Youth exchange programs are the various facets that shall form the components of this course. The pattern of evaluation will be in the form of continuous assessments and will comprise of internal and external assessment. NOTE




